Laureates are chosen after an independent, international and consultative selection procedure that guarantees transparency and objectivity.

Laureates are awarded 120,000 Euro in recognition of research studies already published as well as to support future research.

The 7th Danone International Prize for Nutrition award ceremony will take place at the International Union of Nutritional Sciences' (IUNS) Congress, Bangkok October 4-9, 2008.



IX National Workshop on Food & Nutrition Widyakarya Pangan dan Gizi Nasional - WNPG IX Jakarta, August 26 - 28, 2008

The workshop was organized by the Indonesian Institute of Sciences (LIPI). The workshop is a four-yearly scientific event held since 1968. For this year, the theme was: Improving Food and Nutrition Security to Achieve the Millennium Development Goals. The Indonesian Danone Institute Foundation (DII) co-sponsored the activity by supporting two international speakers namely: Dr. Kraisid Tontisirin (Mahidol University, Thailand) and Dr. Reynaldo Martorell (Emory

Total participants of the workshop were about 700, coming from various institutions in Indonesia. Eight Keynote speakers from international & national institutions presented papers in the plenary forum. The parallel sessions were divided into 5 groups, namely Improving Community Nutrition, Food Quality and Safety, Healthy life style, Food security, and Institutionalization of food and nutrition. Four satellite meetings were conducted in relation to the workshop, one of which was organized by the Foundation. Recommendations of the workshop will be considered for future national health program / government policy.



# DANONE BACK TO SCHOOL Edukasi 'Hidup Hijau'

The rapid growth of technology and industry, on one hand, has improved our lives. On the other hand, they contributed to the pollution and damaged the environment. As a response, Danone Dairy Indonesia released a program for school children called 'Danone Back To School; Edukasi Hidup Hijau'. The program will be implemented in 1,000 schools in Jabodetabek area, Central and East Java, particularly schools in Jakarta, Bogor, Bekasi, Cikarang, Tangerang, Serang, Ciawi, Bandung, Cirebon, Purwokerto, Malang, Surabaya, Sidoarjo, Banyuwangi, Solo, Semarang, and Yogyakarta. The main activity of the program is to promote 'green living' by supporting recycling process. The school children are asked to collect garbage around them, especially empty plastic bottles and pouches.

# 2007 Activities

#### **RESEARCH GRANT 2007**

The selection started with screening for completeness of documents, then screening by scientific members, followed by expert review and proposal presentation.

Total proposals received was 54, originating from 21 institutions, of which 22% were doctorate. From the 18 passed document screening, 7 were evaluated by experts, 3 were called for presentation, and one winner was selected. ### **Obesity Seminar** Obesity as a Poverty-related Emerging Nutrition Problem in Indonesia

The one-day seminar was co-organized together with the School of Health Nutrition, Universitas Gadjah Mada. The seminar was attended by 340 participants from 21 different cities and 15 provinces, of which 68% were undergraduate and post-graduate students, and the rest were university lecturers and other professionals.

#### Over Nutrition & Obesity Problem in Poor Community: Is it Possible?

On one hand, undernutrition still exists in developing countries. On the other hand, overnutrition / obesity increases. Both problems decrease the quality of national human resources and increase national economic burden. Undernutrition caused un-optimal physical growth & cognitive development, which reduces productivity and leads to poverty. Obesity is the main cause of degenerative diseases.

Globally, there are more than 1 billion people who are overweight, of which 300 million of them are obese. Since 1980, in some places in North America, UK, Eastern Europe, Middle East, Pacific Island, Australia & China, the number of people who are overnourish has increased three-fold (WHO 2006). Surprisingly, over nutrition often happened in children. In Africa, the increasing number of overweight children is much faster than in developing countries altogether. The main cause of over nutrition is imbalance diet, diet with high carbohydrates, sugar & saturated fat, with less physical exercise. The less consumption of vegetable and fruit, decreases intake of vitamins & minerals that are needed to reduce the risk of chronic diseases.

The evidence of dual problem of malnutrition, that is an over weight and undernourish household member found in the same household, are found in Guatemala and other poor countries, including Indonesia. Buku Rencana Aksi Pangan dan Gizi Bappenas (2006) showed that number of over weight women (BMI > 25) in rural area increases, especially, among 30-44 years old.

The seminar was intended to give information to the government and the public that food and nutrition problem are faced with not only poverty and under nutrition, but also with over nutrition, obesity, and its consequences.

### **GRANT SELECTION 2008**

A total of 36 proposals were received this year. The proposals originated from 22 institutions, of which 7 were for doctorate research. From a third (10 proposals) that passed on to the next screening process, 7 were called for presentation, of which 5 were granted. ## CHILD GROWTH & MICRONUTRIENT DEFICIENCIES: NEW INITIATIVES FOR DEVELOPING COUNTRIES TO ACHIEVE MILLENIUM DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Expert Meeting Jakarta, August 25<sup>th</sup>, 2008

The meeting was a satellite meeting to the IX National Workshop on Food and Nutrition (WNPG). In the meeting, experts were gathered to have a retrospective view on child growth – lessons learned from programs to overcome under-nutrition in the developed countries - and to discuss the way forward for Indonesia and its implications for future programs. The meeting was attended by 43 international & national experts coming from various fields.

The three international speakers were :

1.Dr. Reynaldo Martorell, Hubert Department of Global Health, Rollins School of Public Health, Emory University, USA. 2.Dr. Ray Yip, Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, China

3. Prof. Jose Boccio, Ph.D., School of Pharmacy and Biochemistry, University of Buenos Aires, Argentina

In the meeting, Dr. Jean-Michel Antoine, Danone Research, France shared on the commitment of Danone Institute International on sound scientific research worldwide.

Conclusions & recommendations from the meeting were formulized by the participants at the end of the meeting and forwarded to the government and other relevant institutions as a base for future actions, and will be published as a proceeding of the National Food and Nutrition Workshop:

- Stunting started in utero Birth weight, Growth faltering starts early in life, Catch-up growth is invisible
- The long-term effect of growth retardation exists
- Positive Effect of multiple micronutrient supplementation and fortification (Ca, Fe, Zn) in early life
- Food Fortification is visible: technology is available for various carriers
- Focus on window of vulnerability group: pregnant women and child 0-2 years,
- Integrated Health Post (Posyandu) should be re-activated effectively by emphazising growth monitoring and action; prevent early growth retardation of children 0-2 years, especially the poor.
